
problem

· the look.

With classic recessed-panel cabinetry and a palette of white, grey and blue, the kitchen went from builder-basic to timeless, pretty and fresh.

· the layout.

Adding a long island created a galley-style kitchen. "The big question was where to put the sink," says Vanessa. "Since the homeowner didn't want a sink in the island - because it would have attracted more mess - we put it in the corner, which was a good solution for her."

· the extras.

The island includes an eating area, which takes the spot of the kitchen table, and comfortably accommodates this family of four. Details like the Moroccan-style glass backsplash and decorative mesh-panelled cabinet doors add a distinctive quality.

· the materials.

White-painted maple cabinetry with recessed-panel doors; off-white engineered quartz countertops; white glass mosaic backsplash tiles; oak hardwood floors; chrome pendant lights; satin nickel hardware; stainless steel appliances.
